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Trees lost and saved



Among the many trees which were lost in Storm Eunice and other recent storms was this old beech in Parc Natur Penglais. It was probably planted in the early 19th century.



This cherry tree in Waunfawr was due to be felled by the county council to complete an Active Travel Route for walkers and cyclists. After protests, it was spared, at least for the time being.

Maes Gwenfrewi



North Road Park is to be renamed Maes Gwenfrewi after the nearby former Catholic church of St Winefride. The Town Council, who lease the site, have successfully applied for a grant from the Welsh Government to redevelop the area in order to increase biodiversity and the park's general ambience. The old rope maze has been removed and the park is being attractively laid out. GAG contributed advice on trees to plant. The plans include new fruit trees and an area for local people with an interest to grow their own flowers and vegetables.

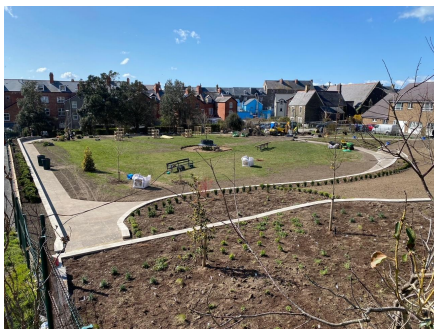

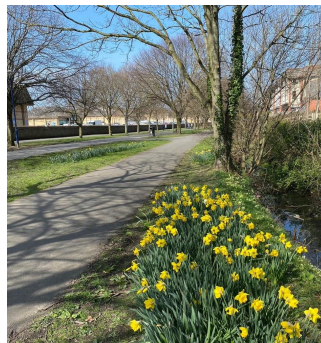
