Plascrug Avenue: a little local patch

I am a firm believer that birds can be found almost anywhere. Like many people interested in birds I like to visit the hotspots, but also get a great deal of satisfaction from my local patch. For me, Plascrug Avenue fits the bill. It has a variety of birdlife to maintain my interest and is small enough to cover during a lunch break. So writes *Harry Pepper* in an article about the winter birds of Plascrug in the *Ceredigion Bird Report 2008*.

Blackbirds are present all along the avenue, often accompanied by a few **Song Thrushes**, while **Redwings** are sometimes found in the trees at the cemetery, with occasional **Fieldfares** preferring the adjacent playing field. The mature trees, bushes and hedgerows hold **Chaffinches**, **Greenfinches**, **Great and Blue Tits**, while the commonest bird is the **Robin**. **Wrens** can be seen at close range foraging the low vegetation, with parties of **Long-tailed Tits** and **Goldfinches** preferring the area between the Rheidol Retail Park and the Crown Building.

Less regular are **Nuthatch**, **Treecreeper** and **Goldcrest**, while the tall trees near the cemetery provide occasional sightings of **Coal Tit** and **Siskin**. Each autumn I await the first **Kingfisher**, when a careful approach to favoured stretches of the ditch will provide good views. It was on one of these approaches that I flushed my first **Jack**

Snipe, but during a cold snap **Common Snipe** may turn up. During spells of cold weather a **Little Egret** has taken up residence, providing interest even among non-birders. On one occasion it brought work in a Crown Building office to a standstill as it struggled for 20 minutes trying to swallow an eel.

A new bird was added to my Aberystwyth list in February 2008 when, approaching the far end of the ditch, I was surprised to find myself looking at a **Water Rail**, which stayed for another two weeks. This was a very productive period. During one lunchtime walk lasting only half an hour, I saw Little Egret, Kingfisher, Water Rail and Snipe as well as the usual small birds and even had a **Kestrel** flying over to finish off.

Not all visits produce such birds, but even on the quietest of days it is good to get out in the fresh air to have a look, before returning to work refreshed and wondering what the next day will bring.

Garden Trees

People living within the Aberystwyth and Llanbadarn Fawr Conservation Areas should be aware of certain regulations regarding the management of trees in their gardens. In essence, subject to a few exceptions, the County Council requires 6 weeks notice of any proposal to cut down or carry out work on any tree. The Council has a useful leaflet which gives further details. Rydw i'n credu'n gryw fod adar i'w cael ym mhobman. Fel llawer o'r rhai sydd â diddordeb mewn adar, rydw i'n hoffi ymweld â "hotspots", ond mae fy milltir sgwâr yn rhoi llawer o fodhad i mi. Yn fy marn i, mae Rhodfa Plascrug yn siwtio i'r dim. Mae'r adar yn ddigon amrywiol i gadw fy niddordeb i, ac mae'n ddigon bach i weld y cyfan yn yr awr cinio. Dyna farn *Harry Pepper* mewn erythegl am adar y gaeaf Plascruf yn y "Ceredigion Bird Report 2008".

Mae **Adar duon** ar hyd y rhodfa, gan amlaf yng nghwmni ychydig o **Fronfreithod** (*Song Thrushes*). Yn achlysurol ceir **Cochion Dan-adain** (*Redwings*) yng nghoed y fynwent, gydag ambell un **Socan Eira** (*Fieldfare*) yn dewis y meysydd chwarae cyfagos. Gwelir **Ji-bincod** (*Chaffinches*), **Llinosod gwyrrd** (*Greenfinches*), **Titwod mawr** (*Great tits*), **Titwod Tomos las** (*Blue tits*) yn y coed llawn dwf, y llwyni a'r cloddiau, a'r aderyn mwyaf cyffredin yw'r **Robin Goch**. Gwelir **Drywod** (*Wrens*) yn agos, yn chwiliota yn y llwyni, tra bod heidiau o **Ditwod Cynffon-hir** (*Long-tailed tits*) a **Nicos** (*Goldfinches*) yn dewis y ardal rhwng Parc Siopa Rheidol ac Adeilad y Goron.

Yn llai aml, ceir **Delor y Cnau** (*Nuthatch*), **Dringwr Bach** (*Treecreeper*) neu **Dryw Eurben** (*Goldcrest*), a gwelir **Titw Penddu** (*Coal Tit*) neu **Pila Gwyrd** (*Siskin*) yn y coed uchaf wrth y fynwent. Bob

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hydref, byddaf yn disgwyli **Glas y Dorlan** (*Kingfisher*) cyntaf: cewch olygfeydd da os ydych chi'n ofalus wrth fynd yn nes at ei hoff gynefinoedd. Unwaith, wrth fynd yn agos, codais y **Giach Bach** (*Jack Snipe*) am y tro cyntaf, ond mewn ysbaid oer, ceir y **Giach Cyffredin** (*Common Snipe*). Yn y tywydd oer, ymgartrefodd **Crêyr Bach Copog** (*Little Egret*), gan dynnu sylw rhai nad oedd yn wylwyr adar. Unwaith, stopiodd gwaith yn Adeilad yn Goron yn stond wrth ymdrechu am ugain munud i lyncu llysywen.

Ychwanegais aderyn newydd i fy rhestr ym mis Chwefror 2008 wrth nesáu at ben eithaf y deitsh, pan welais, er fy mawr syndod, **Rhegen y Dŵr** (*Water Rail*), a arhosodd am ddua wythnos. Adeg ffrwythlon iawn oedd hynny. Wrth gerdded am ddim ond hanner awr, amser cinio, roeddwn i'n gweld Crêyr Bach Copog, Glas y Dorlan, Regen y Dŵr a Giach, yn ogystal â'r adar mân arferol, ac i gau pen y mwdwl hedfanodd **Cudyll coch** (*Kestrel*) dros ein pennau.
