



# LWYBR COED

Aberystwyth a Llanbadarn Fawr

Coed Aber was specially funded by the Welsh Government and Ceredigion County Council between 2013–2015 to create an avenue of over 280 trees lining the new approach road from Llanbadarn Fawr into Aberystwyth.

# Aberystwyth and Llanbadarn Fawr Tree Trail

**Distance:** approx. 5.0 km (3.1 miles) ●●●

**Time:** allow 1½ to 2hrs

**Surface:** tarmac suitable for buggies and wheel chairs

**Start:** from railway station turn right past the bus station to Plascrug gates. On the way note: ① Silver Maple which provides welcome shade for sitting and ② Mountain Ash (or Rowan) marking our Fair Trade town status. Walk through the decorative wrought iron gates down Plascrug Avenue, a wonderful example of Victorian foresight, with more than 140 trees of 18 different species maintained by the County Council and providing a much-loved traffic-free avenue for walkers, runners and cyclists.

Cross the Pelican crossing, go left and immediately right to take the multiuse tarmac track. On your left an emergency flood sump includes a Birch copse **6** with an information board colour-coded with corresponding tree marker posts. The walnut trees are behind you. At **7** an

Cwadwch i'r chwilti yma er mwyn mynd ar hyd y llywyr wrth y myl  
planu mewm triogol gwyntyd a bwriad gwyntodol o wedi a  
gydnod i'r tredau hanes hysbys o ymgrediad rhwng yr ymddyngau  
i'r dorfau a'r pentrefi.

Y warchodaeth natur wrth ymddydd sy'n dyddio i'r coed gwenn a ffelygiad ar ei gyflymwyd yn ystod llywedd yng Nghymru. Mae'r llwybr tarmac yn parhau heibio i ail bwl i ddal dŵr liffogydd 8 gyda chwech bedw yn benod ac yn mynd tu o'i Barc Siopa Parc Y Llyn.

unsurfaced route **OO** which can be taken in dry weather through the Alder and Willow on the riverside nature reserve. The tarmac path continues past a second flood lagoon **8** with mainly Birch trees and behind Parc y Llyn Retail Park.

On reaching the main road turn right to take the underpass, turning left up the slope to walk beside the main road with 3 large White Poplars and a Willow edging the playing fields. You will come to a wide grassy area **9** planted with a variety of trees identified on 2 information boards. Walk on past the 8 Ornamental Pears, turning round at the Coed Aber sign. Retrace your steps through the underpass, turning right to see more plantings, including Dawn Redwoods **10**. Look out for orchids in flower (May–June).

Walk back to **8** then turn right along a short, wide, rough-surfaced path past the Glan Rheidal estate and a surgery. Turn left towards the centre of town. Ornamental Cherries **11** outside the County Council and Welsh Government Offices can be seen across the road (Ffordd Parc y Llyn). All plantings along this road will mature to create the new avenue into town. Continue towards the lagoon **6** noting the row of Turkish Hazel inside the fence and more Coed Aber plantings on both sides of the road (Boulevard de St Brieuc).

Before the Police Station there are more unusual species planted in a green triangle and information board 12. Bear left here taking the riverside path with mainly Hawthorn and Sycamore to arrive at a car park, and new trees (Ornamental pears) in a grassy bank 13. Walk down the slope into the car park. Note the row of Cherries and Whitebeams to your left as you continue to the main road.

Turn left past more street trees towards the pedestrian lights; cross here and turn left. At the roundabout turn right past 4 mature trees (14), (2 Oaks, 2 Horse Chestnuts), on the way back to the Railway Station.
